



Outdoor and Sun Safety Policy

Statement of Intent

We value outdoor play as an intrinsic part of the curriculum. By ensuring outdoor play is an integral part of the nursery routine we consciously seek to transmit a positive attitude to the outdoors and enrich the child's understanding of the world around him/her.

Active learning experiences outdoors, are essential for young children. They give children opportunities to practice their developing skills, make them feel good and to explore their world. It is also important for children's physical, mental and emotional development.

We believe that children should begin to take risks and face challenges outdoors. The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) fully supports playing outdoors.

Aim

We aim to provide a safe, stimulating outdoor environment where space is used effectively to enable children to explore a broad and balanced curriculum using a range of interesting resources suitable to their individual needs. We ensure that the children have free use of the outdoor area as a context for learning throughout the year.

Method

The outdoor area will be resourced and available for the children to access daily.

Children will be able to choose to use the outdoor area freely during the day and focused activities may be planned for outdoors.

Children will need to have appropriate outdoor clothing for the weather to enable them to fully access the activities outside.

This will include, but are not restricted to:

- Waterproof coat
- Hat and gloves
- Shoes/ Welly boots appropriate for playing out in
- Sun protection cream and a hat

We believe that access to the outdoor area is beneficial to the health and wellbeing of young children. Consequently, we do not want to restrict a child's choice to play and learn outdoors.

Staff will make observations to inform future planning when working with children in the outdoor area.

Safety

Safety will always be of prime consideration, and the following measures will be taken to minimize the risks of playing outside –

- A member of staff will inspect the area before taking the children outside.
- Children are always supervised.
- Whenever children are using the outdoor area, we will ensure it is appropriately staffed using the same ratios of adults to children as apply indoors. If a member of staff must leave their designated position/area they should advise another member of staff that they are doing so.
- We have a high adult/child ratio and all staff on duty will be involved in the supervision of children during outside play.
- Children play at their own level on the play equipment, closely watched by the staff who will give assistance if a child gets into difficulty.
- Staff should be vigilant for the presence of unauthorized persons and follow procedures set in the policy '*Visitor and Intruder Policy*'
- If a child should go missing during outdoor play staff should alert the Nursery Manager and follow procedures set in the policy '*Child going missing Policy*'

Sun Safety

At the nursery we understand that young skin is delicate and very easily damaged by the sun and that this damage may develop into skin cancer in later life. All children, no matter whether they can easily or not, should be protected from the sun, and sunscreen should be applied generously and regularly as it can easily be washed, rubbed or sweated off.

At the start of each summer term parents are reminded by, newsletter/ email/ to send their child in with a hat, and that they should apply sunscreen to their child in the mornings as necessary.

Throughout the day, a staff member will reapply suncream where necessary/in the afternoon to ensure children stay protected. When applying sun cream to children more than one adult will be present and staff will only apply to exposed skin.

Parents confirm prior to their child starting on the nursery app that they are happy for staff to reapply suncream throughout the day.

Adverse Weather Conditions

The nursery is committed to providing uninterrupted care all year round and has the highest regard of safety for children in our care. This applies in all weather conditions, including periods of floods, storms, snow and extreme heat. The nursery is prepared for and resilient to climate-related risks, as stated in our Climate Action Plan for adaption and resilience.

As a nursery, we:

- Implement and regularly review our Heatwave Response Plan (hydration, shade, cool spaces)
- Track and record local weather events that affect nursery operations and adapt routines accordingly.
- Train staff annually on safeguarding children during extreme weather conditions.

In the event that the nursery would need to close for adverse weather conditions, we would contact all parents prior to the opening of the nursery to explain our closure. This will be from the nursery Director, Molly Blackburn and Manager, Holly Butler. Parents will be informed when the nursery will re-open.
